### Memorial Garden Happenings

A huge "thank you" to all who donated to make Phase II a reality. By Christmas all of the flowers will be planted!

We are now ready to take orders for cast-bronze plaques and engraved brick pavers. Anyone may pay for a cast-bronze plaque to be affixed to the plaque wall, but the name on the plaque must be that of a deceased member of the church. Cost of a cast-bronze plaque is \$250, and you may have up to three lines of wording.

If you wish to memorialize or honor someone such as a parent, child, relative or friend who is or was not a member of the church, you may purchase an engraved brick for the paved area that will be installed in front of the plaque wall. A 4" x 8" engraved brick costs \$100, and an 8" x 8" square costs \$190. Three lines of up to 18 characters per line may be engraved on the brick. Five or six lines are allowed on the square.

There are price breaks for orders of more than 1 brick if purchased at the same time.

Order forms for plaques, bricks and squares are available in the back of the sanctuary in the little plastic box next to the permanent display on the right-hand wall. Checks should be made payable to UUCT, with "Memorial Garden plaque, brick or square" in the memo line.

Thanks for your continued support of this beautiful addition to our church grounds.

### Right Relations Initiative

When asked what makes us proudest of our congregation during the 2004 congregational assessment, two of the three most frequent responses included (1) tolerance and acceptance of diverse ideas, beliefs, and cultures and (2) the caring nature of our congregation. A common theme in the congregational conversations we have had since then, however, has been that we have room for improving our relationships with each other and with our ministers.

In an effort to enhance the personal interrelationships within our church, the Committee on the Ministry is working with Reverend Lyn and several other members of our congregation to coordinate a Right Relations Initiative that will culminate in a congregation-wide process to develop a Covenant of Right Relations.

What does it mean to speak of right (3) Sunday service on Right relations? "Towards Right Relations" was the theme of the **UUA General Assembly this past** summer. In a keynote address to the Assembly, Jim Wind, president of the Alban Institute, described right relations as "healthy, lifegiving, respectful, loving, and open relationships with one another."

The UUCT Right Relations Initiative includes a number of facets which are briefly summarized here. Some have already transpired, others will be forthcoming. Watch for more details in future issues of The Meridian and through other media.

- (1) Sunday service on **Covenanting** – Presented by Rev. Lyn on October 15. Copies of her sermon, "Covenant: From Sinai to Tallahassee," are available on the sanctuary back counter.
- (2) Adult Forum on Practicing Right Relationship -Scheduled for December 17. this is a warm up for an Adult Enrichment course to be offered by Jennifer Carver and Isabel Sheridan based on a book of the same title: Practicing Right Relationship: Skills for Deepening Purpose, Finding Fulfillment, and Increasing Effectiveness in Your Congregation, by Mary K. Sellon and Daniel P. Smith.
- Relations To be presented by Rev. Lyn on January 14.
- (4) Practicing Right Relations course - This six-week long course, based on Sellon and Smith's book *Practicing Right* Relationship, will provide a group of UUCTers an opportunity to spend time learning about right relations and how practicing right relations helps strengthen our church community. Participants

will actually practice right relations through a series of inclass and outside activities. sharing circles, readings, reflection and journaling, in a format similar to Evensong. Scheduled to start in late January. Look for more information in the January Meridian or talk with Jennifer Carver or Isabel Sheridan.

- (5) Right Relations in Committee - An option to be provided to the church's committees via the Church Council to conduct a few selected exercises from the **Practicing Right Relations** course.
- (6) Right Relations Covenanting Workshop – To be facilitated by Rev. Lyn on a weekend in late March or early April. This will produce a draft covenant to be further refined by a small task force and presented to the congregation for discussion and formal adoption at the annual meeting in May. We hope to make this a churchwide event, with activities for children and youth so that all parents can participate and with a celebratory festival dinner following conclusion of the workshop.

### How Are We Doing This Year?

The UUA Settlement Office requests evaluation, by both the interim minister and the lay leadership, of the progress of a congregation that is "in the interim" by February 15 and June 15 of every year. Each of these evaluations reviews progress made toward goals set at the beginning of to share on how we are doing as a the interim.

The Executive Board, the Committee on the Ministry (COTM). and Rev. Lyn will collaborate to prepare this evaluation in late January. If you have any thoughts

### Are We Tallahassee's Best Kept Secret?

If we are serious about increasing the membership of our church, why do we forego the most effective (and cost-effective) way of putting out the good word? I'm referring to the church street sign.

I was told the sign was selected to "blend in" (or something to that effect). Think about that for a moment. A sign designed to "blend in" is like a candle that sheds no light, a book of blank pages, a face that can't be kissed, a kielbasa that can't . . . you get the idea.

Here's a contest/game: Try to find any church sign in Tallahassee that conveys less information than ours. While other churches list times, events, and pass along pithy (yes, sometimes idiotic) messages, we don't even announce when services are held!

To take two nearby examples, the church just north of us has an attractive sign that offers ample space for information. NFC/Temple Baptist has two "scrolling" signs. All we have on our sign is our

name and the street address number. Yes, the number might be helpful, except the only people who read it are already there.

Think about the thousands of cars that pass the church everyday (often at a crawl). What message does our sign convey? I think it whispers, "We're back in the woods . . . leave us alone."

Is that all we have to say to the community?
