



Mahatma Gandhi uttered quite a few pithy statements that tend to be repeated time and time again, for they do indeed speak to so many people. One of the most intriguing – and challenging – for me is when he said, "You must be the change you wish to see."

It is challenging for me because I find it is so easy to criticize what I see as wrong with society today, to ridicule, to find fault, or to be just plain angry at the failures we see around us every day.

It is another matter to realize that I may very well be part of the problem as well, and that I have the grace and the power within me to be part of the solution to whatever is not right in the world. This is just as true with those in the farthest reaches of darkest Africa or Asia as it is true with my own failures and those of my closest associates.

If I am angry because someone is particularly irritating to me or has failed me somehow, I have the power to change not that person, but to change the way in which I respond to that person. And perhaps, a different response to that person, filled with care, love and respect, will be a catalyst for that person to change.

If I see social ills in my neighborhood or anywhere in the world, there are things I can do, perhaps only in a small way, but things that can contribute to changing that social injustice or problem. By changing my attitude from one of cynicism and helplessness to one of caring and reaching out, I could be well on the road to being the change I wish to see.

Could you see yourself as being the change you wish to see? Is this as much of a challenge to you as it is to me? Do you find it far easier to criticize, find fault or drop out than to pitch in and be part of the solution, the change needed?

When I see us here at UUCT come together to work out our challenges, with much good, honest conversation, much insight expressed, much thoughtful suggestion, I feel that we are accepting the challenge and doing well to meet it and benefit from it. And I have every confidence that we can continue to meet this "Gandhi" challenge, to be the change we wish to see for ourselves here at UUCT.

# Settled Minister Search Committee

The SMSC has considered a total of 10 prospective settled minister candidates. We are told by Rev Lyn that we've done well to receive this many applicants based on her review of some of the other churches currently in search.

We have one pre-candidate confirmed for a neutral pulpit visit. We are very excited by her candidacy and at this time believe she would be an excellent fit with our congregation's needs.

We have released seven of the other candidates based on their Ministerial Records, Information Packets, and/or telephone interviews. Two others withdrew before we scheduled interviews with them.

All of our eggs are, therefore, in one basket, unless we receive one or more late inquiries. While this is not an ideal state of affairs, we believe strongly that we should only seriously consider candidates who will truly fulfill our needs.

It is a very tight market, so there is a chance that we may not succeed. If such a situation comes to pass, we are prepared to shift gears to searching for an interim minister for one more year. The deadline for submitting an application for that process is not until April 15, so there will be plenty of time to consider our options.

## **Dept. of Corrections Donations**
