#### **TEAM Report**

Dexter Easton, Dick Leinberry, Howard Pardue, Brian Lee, Elspeth Stowell, and Tom and Norene Chase were UUCT's delegates to the Community Problems Assembly for TEAM (Tallahassee Equality Action Ministry) on May 1. Other church members planned on being there but at the last minute could not attend. 282 representatives of the 22 member churches voted and chose the new study and action for this next year. Youth Concerns/Education won with 228 votes, and Environment/ Energy was second with 33 votes, followed by UUCT's choice,

Domestic Violence, 4 votes, Crime/Drugs 15 votes and Transportation 3 votes.

A committee will form to study and bring back recommendations on how to deal with the concerns for our youth. The next community meetings for the Justice Ministry Network will be the Rally on Mon. 10/1 and the Action Meeting on Mon. 10/22.

Past years' studies do not go away; for example the Health Care Committee is very active. Norene is a member of that group. Others are working on affordable housing and transportation, including improving our bus system. They worked to provide needed bus shelters. # Seven Simple Ways to Slow Global Warming

- Use CF (compact fluorescent) light bulbs. Each saves an average of \$30 on energy costs, uses 2/3 less energy, and lasts 10x longer than traditional bulbs.
- 2. Go vegetarian once a week. It takes 25 gallons of water to produce one pound of beef.
- Don't use drive-throughs. Ten seconds of idling costs more than shutting off and turning on your engine – and adds to CO2 emissions.
- Recycle one aluminum can a day. One can has enough energy to keep a 100-watt bulb burning for almost 4 hours or run your TV for 3 hours.
- Walk, bike, use mass transit or carpool. Each gallon of gas

- dumps 26 pounds of CO2 into the atmosphere.
- Unplug electronic devices such as camera or cell phone chargers. This can save 93 pounds of CO2 from the atmosphere.
- Turn off water while brushing teeth to save 180 gallons of water per month.

# April Board Actions

The UUCT Executive Board met 4/22/07 and took these actions:

Approved 3/25/07 board minutes.

Approved March 2007 Treasurer's Report.

Authorized Finance Committee to fund 2006-2007 UUA Fair Shares from operating budget first, then from reserves if necessary.

Approved proposed fundraiser list and 2007-2008 final budget for recommendation to congregation.

Placed on Annual Meeting agenda: proposed Covenant of Right Relations and proposed Bylaws modifications regarding Committee on the Ministry membership and Manual of Policies and Procedures (MPP) revision frequency, deadline, and Board approval.

Approved having MPP revisions distributed as PDF files via email, with hard copies available to those without email capabilities.

Appointed three voting members of DRE Search Committee from among RE lay leadership and directed that two other members be found from Board-suggested list.

Authorized DRE Search Committee to spend up to \$1,000 in search expenses (including \$400 already spent for advertising).

## May Congregational Actions

At the Annual Congregational Meeting 5/20/07, with a required quorum of 41 and 54 members in attendance, the congregation took the following actions:

Approved unanimously the 2/25/07 and 4/22/07 congregational meeting minutes.

Elected unanimously to begin terms 7/1/07: Annette Pearce as president-elect, Bob Deyle as secretary, Eliza Coyne as VP for RE, Joan Patterson as VP for Finance, and Nancy Bass, Christine Boczarska, and Logan Hunter-Thompson as Nominating Committee members.

Approved unanimously the UUCT Covenant of Right Relations.

Approved unanimously the FY 2007-2008 list of fundraisers and Final Budget Summary.

Approved the following modifications to the UUCT Bylaws with no changes from how they had been proposed:

- An increase in membership for the Committee on the Ministry from three members to a minimum of four (unanimous);
- Changes in frequency and deadline for an updated Manual of Policies and Procedures and in number of Board members required for approval of PPM changes (unanimous);
- Several changes to the membership section of the Bylaws including: addition of minimum amount for the required contribution (amount to be determined by Board), provision for consultation with minister on membership matters, provision for non-discrimination on basis of gender identity and expression, and creation of honorary and inactive membership categories (31 in favor, 15 opposed, with a 2/3 majority of those voting required).

Note: There was much discussion about the pros and cons of adding a minimum amount to the already required contribution. A motion to remove the word "minimum" from the proposed membership Bylaws modification was made but failed (25 in favor, 31 opposed, with a simple majority required). The current minimum is the UUA district and national fair share amounts per member— approximately \$75 for 2007-2008.
