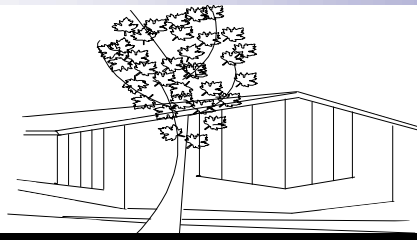

Canvass 2007 - 2008

We're almost there! The Asking Budget for FY 2007-2008 was approved by the congregation on 2/25. The budget total of \$250,198 is an increase of \$20,500 over this year and will require about a 10.5% increase in pledging. It's an ambitious budget in support of an ambitious program and can only be achieved by a corresponding increase in our individual gifts of money and self.

In early March, you'll receive the annual canvass pledging packet consisting of: the 2007-2008 Canvass brochure; a gift of money pledge form with suggested giving guide, and a gifts of self and service pledge form. To finalize our budget we need you to complete and return these forms as soon as possible. To expedite this, you are invited to bring your completed pledge forms to the pledging time and potluck following the March 11 Sunday service. See you there!

We begin our month in considering what is worthy in this congregation and pledging our support for it both financially and in service to the congregation. We end the month in establishing what we need to do to ever better our coming together and being together. An essential month, an inspiring month, a joyous month, a month when we can say, “I am so glad I am a member of this vital congregation!”

A Canvass Message

In my dual roles with the canvass campaign and as a member of the finance committee, I see two trends that can not be sustained simultaneously.

As a congregation, we have big dreams, and we feel passionately about many issues to include religious education, music, social justice activities, excellent Sunday services and being a UUA fair share congregation, just to name a few. Many times these dreams manifest themselves in the form of a larger budget request. This trend is an increasing financial burden.

In looking at the list of contributing members and supporting friends, I have seen another trend: significantly fewer members and

friends are pledging this year than last year. Maybe some of us are waiting around to see what the settled minister brings? "I'll wait 'til September and see if I like the minister." These two trend lines can not be sustained indefinitely.

As we near the end of our second year of interim ministry, I know that we are excited about the calling of a settled minister. Each of us holds an expectation that we can build and grow with the stability and shared vision that a settled minister can bring. However, we can't wait for August and September to begin that journey.

I submit that the realization of these dreams and passions doesn't start in August. It starts in

early March, when we sit down with our pledge sheets. Will members and supporting friends renew their pledges with an increase? Will members and friends who have stopped contributing start again, with a little faith that all of us contributing something will help make our dreams a reality. My hope is that we answer "yes."

Hollie and I will be increasing our pledge. Let us jointly lay the groundwork for a great year. It starts in March. Let's not procrastinate!

The Social Justice Committee met in Feb. to discuss the social justice direction for our church. A review of the social justice surveys finds that we are a very diverse group with a wide variety of interests. (Surprise!) Two common themes stood out:

- 1) Begin a study/action group on the 2006 General Assembly Peacemaking Study/Action Issue — Should the UUA reject the use of any and all kinds of violence and war to resolve disputes between people and nations and adopt a principle of seeking just peace through non-violent means?
- 2) Act locally as a way of both helping our community and strengthening our image as a concerned church.

The committee decided to take the following immediate actions:

- Continue gathering feedback from the SJ survey. If you haven't, please complete one.
- Begin deeper dialog on SJ

issues with 'Issue Dinners.'

These will be potlucks that focus discussion on a particular issue. The first will be in **April**, with the focus on the **Peacemaking Study/Action Issue**. Contact **Kim Ross** by **Mar. 15** to express an interest and have your schedule taken into consideration.

Florida District Executive February Message: Excerpts

In his February message to Florida congregations, District Executive Rev. Kenn Hurto gives some possible answers to the question: Whom do we serve?

The first five answers he lists are from congregational leaders at a recent Board retreat:

- We serve the alienated and disaffected.
- We serve naturalists.
- We serve the universally minded.
- We serve rationalists.
- We serve justice-seekers.

Rev. Kenn writes: "This is a good start. For many, Unitarian Universalism is an alternative to

something, a haven and refuge. We serve those seeking a sanctuary from dehumanizing and hurtful beliefs and practices. This is our history. May I suggest as well three additional answers that may guide our future:

- We serve the lost...We need to re-emphasize the Universalist side of our faith that equates God or the holy with the power of love.
- We serve the counter-culture. Unitarian Universalism is not an escape from the social world, but neither is it simply an embrace of what is. More than a matter of justice, we serve those who believe our culture is spiritually sick...

- We serve democracy...We as Unitarian Universalists need to be more fully in the public square defending democracy at every level.

What would you add to this? How would you define our 'mission-field' for our time? What should the District do to support you and your congregation's ministries? Please, drop me a note or give a call.

January Board Actions

The Board took the following actions 1/28/07:

Unanimously approved the Consent Agenda as follows:

a. Accepted title transfer for 1994 Plymouth Voyager van from Ed Oaksford for resale in church auction or other disposition, but not for church use.

b. Accepted report from Committee on the Ministry, and per COTM recommendation, approved spending remaining balance of \$4,400 allocated for Rev Lyn's health insurance premiums to cover a larger proportion of those premiums than the maximum stipulated in her letter of agreement with the congregation.

c. Accepted VP for Management report with correction: projector for Rm. L donated by Hall Engineering, not DeWayne Carver.

Accepted Dec. Treasurer's report.

Accepted minutes from 12/17/06 board meeting.

Approved Settled Minister Search Comm. (SMSC) recommendation to request congregational approval to increase maximum settled minister compensation package which can be offered from \$80,000 to \$85,000.

Authorized SMSC to conduct a settled minister candidate background check pursuant to UUA procedures and convey the results to the board president subsequent to the SMSC's announcement of the candidate to the board.

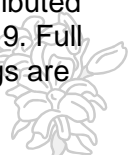
Denied a request for meeting space from the group Code Pink, due to specific political nature of group. Note: Social Justice Committee had recommended sponsorship of the group to allow free use of UUCT space.

Authorized purchasing two Memorial Garden plaques at \$250 each (from the Endowment Fund) for John Murphy and Hazel Richards.

Eliminated requirement for Finance Committee to publish quarterly financial reports in *The Meridian*.

Approved 2007-2008 Asking Budget for proposing to the congregation, with the understanding that there might be a downward adjustment in the Building and Grounds figure.

Note: The board held a special meeting on Feb. 7, rescinded the Jan. 28 vote to adopt the Asking Budget, made some modifications, and approved a new Asking Budget for recommendation to the congregation. This was distributed to the congregation on Feb. 9. Full minutes of all board meetings are available on request.



February Congregational Actions

The congregation took the following actions 2/25/07:

Approved the minutes of the last congregational meeting on 12/03/06.

Elected Abbe Justus to serve as the Vice President for Social Justice (for a term ending 6/30/08).

Approved the proposal recommended by the Settled Minister

Search Committee to permit the Negotiating Team to negotiate a compensation package for our Settled Minister up to \$85,000, a \$5,000 increase from the \$80,000 maximum approved by the congregation at the annual meeting in May 2006.

Approved the proposed asking budget for 2007-2008 with an amendment to provide a cost of

living adjustment (COLA) to the Music Director of \$.10/hr. + 2% for a total increase of \$536. (Note: This same COLA was already provided to other non-ministerial staff in the proposed budget.)

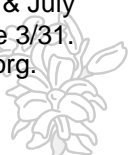
