MINISTER'S MESSAGE

It is the time of beginnings and endings. Old board, new board. Former Director of Religious Education, Incoming Director of Religious Education. Evensong is about over. New projects, new programs. UUCT is poised on the cliff/valley ready to decide what to build. Pledges of money don't meet the goal for the operating budget; lots of money is pledged for a capital campaign; the endowment is shrinking in the marketplace; UUCT will receive substantial bequests. Departed parishioners register in my inner eye. Richard Lee motions me aside, "I get what you were doing in that service" he proclaims. Ralph Cook's voice rises in pitch and sound, "I'm sorry..." he says, and as decent as he is, he maybe doesn't mean it. Sally Bellamy pats my arm, "What was her name again?" she asks. I want you to know how thick you all are in my mind, on this plane and after you die. This is not goodbye, it is a greeting; and it is Thank You. Do you say to each other what you say to me? Do you realize how much pain and delight you carry, as individuals and as a congregation. Are you deepening in your Self, in you humanity, and in humility? Do you know what God means to you, and to me, and to him and to her?

You have come to me to tell of many things. You have called from work, home, the hospital, the road to recovery. On the phone or via e-mail, you spoke in confidence, and I'll not betray it. But I want you to read one of the many possible Alphabet Litanies of the collective struggle and lifeline called UUCT. I honor your words about:

Addiction, Boredom, Creativity, Dying, Evil, Forgiveness,

Grandchildren, Health, Infidelity, Justice, Knowledge, Letting go, Miscarriage, Nuptials, Old age, Pining, Questing, Rage, Sexuality, Truth, Undercurrents, Vocation, Wilderness, Xenophobia, Yourself, [and] Zeal.



On vacation, in Long Beach, California, I encountered the real live version of T.S. Eliot's poetic and mysterious lines: We shall not cease from exploration and the end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started and know the place for the first time. There was a great Greek restaurant on Broadway, and we ate there our first day. After a few rolls of film were ready for developing, we scoured the streets for a one-hour photo shop. Surprise! —the RiteAid was across the street from the restaurant on Broadway. The first Zillion times I navigated Broadway as I taxied Ellen to and from her conference, the RiteAid was not there...or rather I was not in the position to see it. As I continued to explore, I realized needs beyond eating, and beyond memorizing the path from point a to point b without getting distracted or lost. My awareness expanded to include not just the property built up with a Greek restaurant, but also the rest of the corners on the four way stop, and then I became aware of other places on the street.

I think our spiritual journey is circular like that. We revisit the same questions and relive the same encounters with others, and if we apply our new awareness, knowledge, maps and world views, we may know the place for the first time. Eliot may be thinking of the end of exploration as the moment our lives end. I think the end of exploration happens often, and rather than marking the end of our lives, it

launches us through the next curve of our journey, and our quest "to know". To know is to discover, recognize, love, change, respect, value, move on, cherish. And once we know a place — be it geographic and physical, or invisible and on an inner level — I think we realize there's still more exploring to do. I think this moment of discovery inhabits each moment, not just the moment of death. Well, I hope it does. We at UUCT are on a journey together, one that follows a vearly cycle, and a cycle of decisions and crises (which present both danger and opportunity). I witness your individual journeys as well, and I hold your hopes and dreams before you. Go. Search for the place where they may be found. Find them. Know them. Explore some more.
