EUREKA---WE DID IT! A last minute flurry of new pledges raised our total pledge contributions to just over \$200,000. This has allowed the Board to approve a "slimeddown" version of the original FY 2007-08 asking budget, but

one which retains all of our priority objectives; i.e. (1) the costs of a new Settled Minister, (2) a return to full Fair Share contributions for the UUA and District, and (3) minor adjustments to staffing levels to reflect current job requirements.

Within the next week or so, you will receive a copy of this proposed budget for your review and approval at the Annual Congregational Meeting on May 20. Mark that date on your calendar!

UU-UNO News

In mid-April, I attended the UU-United Nations Office Annual Intergenerational Seminar in New York. 60% of the attendees were young people. This year's theme, "Stop Modern Day Slavery," is also a current U.N. emphasis. An estimated 27 million people live in slavery, some in the U.S. More than 80% are women and children.

The statement issued by the seminar, "Stop Modern-Day Slavery: Breaking the Web of Human Trafficking," will go out to the U.N. and all UU congregations in the U.S. and Canada. It calls attention to the code of conduct for the tourist industry and urges UUs to use motels and hotels signing this code. At present Marriot is the only major U.S. chain to sign. Board & Congregational Actions

March Board Actions

The Board met 3/25/07 and took the following actions:

- Accepted 2/24/07 Board minutes.
- Approved the Covenant and Working Agreement negotiated with Rev. Robin Gray in anticipation of her ministerial candidating visit in April.
- Accepted the February Treasurer's Report.
- Appointed a search committee for a new Director of Religious Education, with applications to be taken now for a target start date of 6/1 & "salary and hours dependant on qualifications."
- Decreased the weekly hours for the Office Administrator position from 40 to 30, with benefits pro-rated, effective 7/1 (or earlier if Kathie Mackie resigns before then) based on comparative information for our church size and decision to not add financial record-keeping responsibilities as was planned when hours were increased.
- Accepted written proposal and granted a 5-week, paid sabbatical to the Music Director this coming summer (to be added to 2 weeks of paid vacation), with the understanding that she find volunteer, substitute musicians for that time, thus costing the church no additional funds.

 Approved Bylaws revisions proposed by the Membership Committee for congregational vote at the Annual Meeting.

April Congregational Actions

The congregation met 4/22/07 and took the following action: Pursuant to the congregational vote on 10/16/06 to seek a settled minister in UUA fellowship, accepted the UUCT Settled Minister Search Committee proposal to call the Reverend Robin Gray to be our settled minister, effective 8/1/07, subject to the terms of the Covenant and Working Agreement approved by the Executive Board 3/25/07 and signed by Rev. Gray and Board President DeWayne Carver. (111 in favor, 0 opposed)
