### Minister's Message

#### **Comfort Zones**

After the first service I led in August, someone said to me, "Thank you for helping me out of my comfort zone this morning." I'm not sure if the speaker was 100% grateful; but, the statement reminded me that we all like to get comfortable at church. If you were a bit uncomfortable with folks carrying posters during the sermon, being asked to participate in a congregation-wide conversation, or jumping into spirited, no-hymnal singing, you should know that as service leader I was moving beyond my comfort zone, too. The congregation's enthusiastic responses suggest we may be able to enlarge our comfort zones together.

Talk about leaving your comfort zone, consider how far visitors have ventured outside their comfortable habits. Arriving at church on Sunday, many of you enjoy the comforts of greeting people you've known for years. Each visitor greets a sea of new faces. Fortunately, at UUCT many members extend themselves graciously to help visitors feel comfortable and welcome: individually, immediately, and repeatedly. Greeters welcome people as soon as they arrive. After

services, many members introduce themselves to visitors, engaging them in conversation. Some folks are already adept at introducing their new acquaintance to another.

Yet, there is more still that can help visitors "get comfortable." Let a visitor know you'd like to see her or him again. Invite a visitor to join you at Sunday Forum, Freethinkers' Forum, Knitting, a Dinner for Eight, a potluck, or any other community-building event you will be attending. Or, consider emulating the hospitality of one UU elder. On her first visit to a staid New England church, a young visitor happened to sit next to this elder. At the end of the service the elder member turned to the visitor and invited her to meet over coffee in the coming week. The young visitor in this story is middle-aged now, but she hasn't forgotten the act of inclusion that led her to adopt that church as her own "comfort zone."

Remember, a comfort zone can grow and still be comfortable.

## A Primer on the Minister's Schedule

The posted "office hours" describe several times during the week when I am in the office. That time is often divided between impromptu

or scheduled meetings with individuals, staff supervision, or preparing for meetings with committees. I am also available for appointments during other hours of the week. Call to schedule those appointments in advance, please.

The Minister's Covenant and Working Agreement directs me to reserve one day without ministerial responsibilities and one day devoted to study and writing each week. Monday is my day off. Friday is devoted to study and writing. Please contact me via cell phone for emergencies on those days.

Sometimes I show up at church on my "Sunday off." The covenant and working agreement actually calls for me to be responsible for the service three times a month and encourages me to attend services on other Sundays. That Sunday "out of the pulpit" provides a relief from preaching and an opportunity to appreciate the ministry of lay leaders as they take a turn "in the pulpit."

### Green Corner

At the August Green Sanctuary Committee meeting, we talked about our mission: to promote the idea of lessening our carbon footprints on the planet. Not only do we need to think about how we as a society do this, but we also need to think about how we as individuals can change things about how we live, in order to lessen our impact.

It's so easy to get discouraged and feel like our meager efforts don't amount to much. (Gee, I'm trying to eat locally, but my job dictates that I drive my minivan over 300 miles a week!) However, we on the Green Sanctuary Committee are here to remind you that small efforts by each of us can add up to a lot! Here are some examples from a *Backpacker* magazine article:

- If each person used reusable shopping bags, he/she could save 300-700 plastic bags per year. This equates to 3 to 7 gallons of crude oil. Imagine if 100,000 Tallahasseans did this; we'd save up to 14,000 barrels of oil per year.
- If each household switched to using the air-dry cycle on our dishwashers, we could save 660 pounds of CO2 from entering the atmosphere per year.
- If each person ate just one meal a week prepared from local sources, the country would save 1 million barrels of oil. That's just one meal per week!
- Each compact fluorescent bulb that you use saves 120 pounds of CO2 per year.

Over the course of this year, we're planning on putting a focus on how we eat. We'd like to explore more fully the notion of what impact eating more locally would have. We're going to be talking about the "Slow Food" movement, sponsor some field trips to local agribusinesses and just provide support and education for those of us who want to try to do something to make a difference. After all, in the words of Wendell Berry, "Eaters must understand – how we eat determines how the world is used."
